Utilizing Technology to Succeed in Business

Erick Juarez has a severe to profound sensorineural hearing loss and wears hearing aids in both ears. He does not let his hearing impairment interfere with his current business, **Concept Dumpsters**.

Thanks to Bluetooth technology, Erick is able to directly connect his Phonak hearing aids to his iPhone and iPad. The Compilot accessory device which he wears around his neck, also allows him connect wirelessly to his flat screen television and stereo system.

Ninety percent of his business involves contacting new builders and setting up trash removal dumpsters on their worksites. His wife, Zuly, reports that Erick is on his phone 12 to 14 hours a day communicating with his workers and also builders at the different job sites. Texting and e-mails are critical ways he can convey or clarify issues with respect to each particular job. If there are any language issues, he uses Google to do translations on the fly and respond without delay. He also uses Google Maps to quickly find out the locations of new job sites in the area.

Erick lives in Cary with his wife, Zuly, and their three daughters (ages 14, 10, 8). When he is relaxing, he likes to read books on his Nook unit. He says that he would not be able to run his business adequately if it were not for current technology that allows him to communicate in an efficient and timely manner with his friends and business partners.



New Equipment in Balance Lab

If you visit our balance lab in our Sanford office, you'll notice a bright blue new piece of equipment. It is an Otometrics air caloric unit that helps in the assessment of your balance system.

The unit sends out cold and warm air into the ear canal which stimulates the balance mechanism. The results can often determine if you have a peripheral weakness in one or both balance organs. This information helps the doctor in treating your episodes of dizziness and unsteadiness.
